Letter from the Rector

Come, ye thankful people, come ...

Dear friends,,

The season of harvest festivals is upon us. During this month, the harvest hymn 'Come, ye thankful people, come' will be sung in many of our church harvest services, as we give thanks to God for the food we eat, and for those whose labour has helped to make it possible.

Yet how easy it is for us to take food for granted. Our generation is more removed from the land than any previous one, with a much greater proportion living in an urban rather than rural setting, and many people never see anything of farms and farming.

Even those of us who live in the countryside can so easily drive past our local farms, and walk on footpaths through the fields, without appreciating all that is involved in bringing in the harvest.

It is good that we cultivate an "attitude of gratitude", and not just as harvest-time. Why? Because as we 'count our blessings', so we appreciate more fully 'all good gifts around us' (as another harvest hymn puts it), and so take nothing and no-one for granted.

Living where we do, there is certainly much for which we can be thankful. We have such a beautiful landscape, one that has been shaped by many centuries of farmers working on the land. And those of us who live in or around Melton Mowbray - the 'rural capital of food' - should need no reminding of

just how much food is readily available for us to eat in this country - and not just pork pies and stilton cheese!

Yet harvest-time can also highlight how the fruits of the earth are still not shared equally - some have far too much, while many others have far too little. IN VAST SWATHES OF Africa, crop failure has led to malnutrition and even starvation. And in our own country, there is a huge amount of food waste, while many suffer from food poverty.

Farmers themselves face many challenges working on the land - eg. Low incomes, debt, bureaucracy, poor prices, rising costs, isolation, disease and bad weather - pressure points that often cause great stress, and affect health and relationships.

Perhaps this harvest-time, you and I might consider some way in which we can practically show our harvest 'attitude of gratitude' - both for the work of farms, and also to provide help to those for whom there will be no harvest to celebrate?

The Melton Team Rector writes: "Supporting Christians where faith costs most"

Dear friends,

VILLAGE NEWS

Almost 70 years ago, a young Dutchman started smuggling Bibles to the persecuted church in Communist Europe. He became known as Brother Andrew; you might have read his best-selling book God's Smuggler. His work was the origin on "Open doors" - a Christian organisation hat still distributes hundreds of thousands of Bibles and Christian books every year.

Today, of course, Europe has changed. The main threat to Christians now comes not from Communism, but from Islamist and Hindu extremists and hostile and intolerant regimes. It is a very sad but often overlooked fact that Christianity is the religion on the receiving end of most persecution and discrimination today.

More than 365 mi9llion Christians worldwide - that's a staggering one in seven believers - count the highest cost for following Jesus. So as well as delivering Bibles, Open Doors supports persecuted Christians in other ways: providing training, relief aid, livelihood support and community development projects for hundreds of thousands of Christians around the world.

According to Open Doors' research, over 90% of Christians killed for their faith

last vear were in sub-Saharan Africa. Rising violence is being driven largely by Islamist extremists taking advantage of political instability in the region. For instance, in Nigeria millions of Christians have been displaced by violence and conflict, forced to flee their homes and live in camps for internally displaced people (IDPs) either in their own country or in neighbouring countries.

Iin response, the African church is calling for their brothers and sisters around the world to join them in the *Arise Africa* campaign. It challenges the global community to acknowledge and act against extreme violence and to help the church to be resilient, resourceful and influential.

Then there's North Korea - a country where there is no freedom of religion whatsoever. Christians, especially pastors and missionaries, are treated as spies or enemies, to be rooted out and eradicated. Christians risk the lives of themselves and their families if they own a Bible or teach their children about lesus.

And yet, even in this desperate situation the church is growing. Open Doors' radio ministry encourages the 'underground' church with prayer support and Bible studies. And through their networks in another country.

A talk by John S Thomas of ULAS on the Iron Age hill fort at Burrough Hill. Burrough Hill is an Iron Age hillfort seven miles south of Melton Mowbray. Situated on a promontory about 210 metres above sea level, the site commands views over the surrounding countryside for miles around. There has been human activity in the area since at least the Mesolithic and the hillfort was founded in the early Iron Age (1200 BC to 500 BC). The hillfort seems to have been built in the Middle Iron Age and continued in use until at least the early Roman period. Various excavations have recorded parts of the ramparts, a 'guard chamber', Iron Age/early Roman pits in the fort's interior and roundhouses in the northern part of the fort. John will explain in detail the work that has been undertaken in recent years to learn more about this important site.


